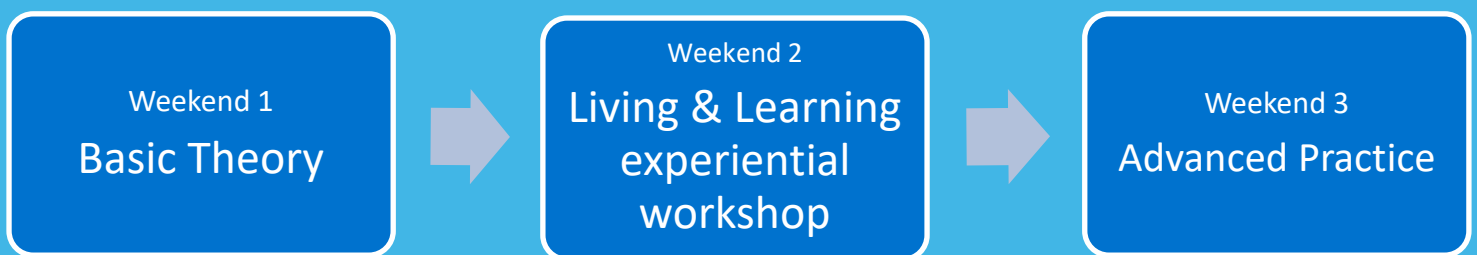
Therapeutic Community & Therapeutic Environments Practitioner training

Unique Training Opportunity

- Developed by leaders in the field of enabling and therapeutic environments
- For practitioners of all levels in NHS, Criminal Justice System, Education & Care systems
- Flexible training can be completed in 2 to 4 years
- Experiential & self-guided learning designed to work around existing work commitments

Course Structure

- Guided reading: based on Handbook of Democratic Therapeutic Community Theory & Practice (supplied) alongside key papers on the theory and practice of relational practice
- Monthly group supervision
- 3 residential weekends (Friday to Sunday)



Course Requirements

- Suitable work placement: can be the participant's regular working role if this is a TC or enabling environment, or on placement. Minimum requirement is for 350 hours, suggested placements of full time for 3 months or a day a week for a year.
- Workplace based project: during the course participants undertake a project within the workplace and present the learning there



The course has been developed by practitioners and ex-service users from Training and Vocational Initiatives in Personality Disorder (TVI), Cassel Hospital, and The Consortium for Therapeutic Communities. It is aimed at anyone who is working in an environment where providing a therapeutic milieu is central to supporting users of the service.
